Education group attacks Sinquefield for "record-setting pace" in donations

The **Missouri Citizen Education Fund**, an arm of the Missouri Progressive Vote Coalition, released today a report entitled: "**Rex Sinquefield: Putting a Price on Politics.**"

The reports details the political spending so far of Sinquefield, the multi-millionaire who helped found the Show-Me Institute. The Kansas City Star published [a profile of Sinquefield](#) last weekend. The Post-Dispatch did one last spring.

The report lists more than \$700,000 that Sinquefield has made so far in donations to various political candidates or groups.

The breakdown includes:

\$345,850 to Missouri legislative and statewide candidates

\$250,000 as seed money for his 100 new political action committees (\$99,450 of that then went as donations to state Sen. **Chris Koster's** campaign for Attorney General)

\$110,000 to the state House Republican Campaign Committee

\$100,000 to All Children Matter, a national group that seeks school choice through vouchers or other means

Sinquefield also acknowledges that he had spent close to \$800,000 to aid the fight against a lawsuit — filed by various school districts — that challenged the state's public school foundation formula. A judge recently ruled against the districts.

"Rex Sinquefield is on a record-setting pace to spend as much money as he can to pass private school voucher legislation in Missouri," said Greg Shufeldt, Political Director of the Missouri Citizen Education Fund. "It is important for Missourians to understand the financial dynamics of Rex Sinquefield and his favored candidates."

A spokeswoman for Sinquefield said that his donations are no different than those of unions or other politically active groups or individuals. "Rex is totally committed to improving education and public schools in Missouri," his spokeswoman said. "Support of candidates who share his view is his right as a public citizen."
