## 2009 MISSOURI SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES LEGISLATIVE SCORECARD

This Legislative Scorecard details the voting record of all 34 members of the Missouri Senate as well as the 163 members of the House of Representatives on critical public policy issues facing the state. The nine bills selected for this scorecard represent crucial issues important to the quality of life of all Missourians.

The bills pertain to issues such as providing quality public education for our children, expanding quality, affordable health care and preserving women's reproductive rights. With this information you can demand that legislators respond to you more than they do the big money special interests who seem to dominate our government.

This scorecard is just one way to evaluate your representatives. Much of the work concerning bills and amendments is done in committee and many important bills never make it to the House or Senate floors for a vote. ProVote encourages you to use the scorecard as one tool to understand your legislator's performance.

## BILL DESCRIPTIONS

- 1. Show Me Health, SB 306** would have established the "Show-Me Health Coverage Plan" to provide restrictive coverage through the private insurance market to some low-income working individuals. The bill passed the Senate, and then was amended in the House. The House version included even more restrictions on coverage. The Senate refused to accept the House changes and the bill died on the House floor. **A vote opposing SB 306 as well as HCS SS SCS SB 306 is a progressive vote.**
- 2. Conceal and Carry, HA 4 SB 171** removes the provision prohibiting a person with a concealed carry endorsement from carrying a concealed firearm into any institution of higher education. This passed in the House, moved to the Senate and was referred to the Judiciary and Civil and Criminal Jurisprudence Committee. **A vote opposing HA 4 SB 171 is a progressive vote.**
- 3. Bullying Revised, HA 2 on HA 1 on HCS SS SB 291** revises definition of bullying to include discrimination based on actual or perceived sexual orientation, gender identity or expression. The amendment was defeated in the House. **A vote supporting HA 2 HA 1 HCS SS SB 291 is a progressive vote.**
- 4. Save Our Secret Ballot, HJR 37** would put on the ballot an initiative to eliminate the right to form unions by majority sign up. This bill passed in the House and is on its third read in the Senate. **A vote opposing HJR 37 is a progressive vote.**
- 5. Unfair Tax, HJR 36** would replace individual and corporate income tax with sales tax (jumping from 3% to at least 10%). This bill passed the House and was referred to in the Ways and Means Committee of the Senate where it eventually died. **A vote opposing HJR 36 is a progressive vote.**

# BILL DESCRIPTIONS

6. **Abortion Restriction, HB 46 and 434** contains numerous new, burdensome and duplicative requirements for counseling, evaluating and performing abortion procedures for women accessing reproductive health care. In addition, the bills create the new felony crime of “coercing abortion” which removes decision-making from the woman seeking the procedure and can also criminalize physicians. HB 46 & 434 passed the House, an amended version, SS on HB 46 and 434, passed the Senate, the House refused to accept the amended version and the bill died on the House calendar. **A vote opposing HB 46 and 434 and SS HB 46 and 434 is a progressive vote.**

7. **Save Our Tips, HB 258** is an attempt to roll back the minimum wage for tipped employees, mostly waiters and waitresses, to \$2.13/hour. The bill passed the House with an amendment to cap the minimum wage at \$3.63 and then stalled in the Senate. **A vote opposing HB 258 is a progressive vote.**

8. **Natural Resources, HB 661** extends the scrap tire fee extension and creates the Energy Futures Fund. It also authorizes the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to distribute economic stimulus funds and extends DNR’s authority to charge fees for construction permits and operating permits related to water pollution control. **A vote supporting HB 661 is a progressive vote.**

9. **DSS Appropriations, CCR SCS HCS HB 11** would have included Medicaid restoration for low income parents making between 20-50% of the federal poverty level (from an income of \$292 to an income of \$763 per month for a family of three) in the state budget. The funds would have been provided by a voluntary Hospital Tax; 35,000 very low income parents would have again qualified for Medicaid. On May 6, the House voted on a version that included this Medicaid restoration and it was defeated. **A vote in support of CCR SCS HCS HB 11 was a progressive vote.**

## FALL VETO SESSION

September 16, 2009

After a bill is Truly Agreed to and Finally Passed by the Missouri State Legislature, the bill is “delivered to the governor” for his signature. The governor has the option to sign a bill into law, veto it or veto in part if it is a budget bill.

During the Veto Session the legislature will review the bills that have been vetoed by the governor and can decide to override his veto by a two-thirds majority vote from both the House and Senate.

Of the bills that ProVote targeted, HB 11 is the only bill the governor vetoed in part. HB 11 is a budget bill focused on the Department of Social Services. He vetoed in part the amount of money appropriated to many of the programs run by the Department of Social Services.

ProVote and our member groups work to elect progressive candidates by fostering grassroots political action. Specifically, we target, recruit and train progressive candidates. We also provide technical assistance to candidates and coalition partners in campaigns, mobilize volunteers and coordinate campaign resources to increase effectiveness.
